Instructions

Take a pencil or crayon, and this Passport with you to hike on each of the indicated Francis Small Heritage Trust trails. When you are hiking the trail, look out for a plaque that looks similar to the Francis Small Heritage Trust turtle, but is a different animal. Make a rubbing of that plaque in the square for that hike. Keep watch! There is one extra credit history or nature plaque along one of these trails! There will be signs at trailheads and important places along the trails for the trail challenge. If you hike all the trails and make rubbings of all the plaques, you will win a prize! Adventurer winners receive a gift card for an iced coffee or similarly priced treat at ***Sugar N Spice Bakery***, at 32 Federal Road, Parsonsfield. Mail your completed Passport to:

Directions:

Colcord Trail to Bald Ledge: The trailhead is on Colcord Pond Road, ¼ mile past Ladyslipper Lane on the opposite side of the road. There is a sign to the right to help find the lot (on the left).

Sawyer Mountain Loop Trail: The trailhead is located at a sharp turn in Route 117, 2.5 miles south of the junction of Routes 25 and 117, or 2.4 miles north of the junction of Routes 11 and 117. To get the extra credit, you must take the Sawyer Mountain Loop via Sawyer Mountain Road and the Sherwood Libby Trail. The extra credit will be found along this loop!

Devils Den Connector loop : From Route 160, take Porterfield Road NW for 1.4 miles. Turn left on Norton Hill Road. Take Norton Hill Road 1.4 miles to a 4 way intersection. Continue straight on Moody Road. Go 0.5 miles on Moody Road to the trailhead for Devils Den on your left. There is a sign to the right to help find the lot. You will walk down Moody Road to the west until you reach a sign for the Devils Den Connector trail on your left, just prior to Smelt Brook. You will have a few choices of routes along the way with signage explaining your options.

Sisson Heath Trail : The GPS address for the turn to the trailhead is approximately 1236 Sokokis Trail N, Cornish, ME (route 5), latitude longitude 43.7278700 - 70.8135100. The parking lot is on a discontinued dirt road (that used to be Watson Hill Rd) that is 5.7 miles from the intersection of Route 25 and 5 in Cornish, or 3 miles from the intersection of Route 5 and 160 in Limerick.
